


As Newnan continues to grow and thrive, ensuring a reliable water supply is more important than ever. Fortunately, Newnan Utilities is fully equipped to meet the needs of our growing community. Our reservoirs, which hold an impressive 1.7 billion gallons of water, are currently at 92% capacity. This robust reserve clearly indicates our unwavering commitment to providing a steady and secure water supply for all residents.

Recently, we completed a vital spillway project, replacing an aging structure to enhance the integrity of our reservoirs. This upgrade ensures we can store water safely and effectively for the long term.

Our state-of-the-art water treatment facility further strengthens our ability to serve Newnan. While the city's average daily water demand is around 6 million gallons, our facility can treat up to 14 million gallons daily. This substantial capacity meets current needs and positions us well to handle increased demand as Newnan grows.

Although our water infrastructure is robust, everyone should still practice water conservation. Simple actions such as fixing leaks, upgrading to water-efficient appliances, and watering lawns during cooler parts of the day contribute to preserving this vital resource.
